An account of my stay in India

January/ February 2020 by Claude Nevers vice-president of the AFEA

(before lockdown in India)

The AFEA's first visit to Snehasadan took place in 1999! So it is exactly 20 years since I met Snehasadan and Father Fonseca for the second time. (the first was 43 years ago). With Bernadette Maret, the president, Hubert Fabrègues, Muriel Bonet, Jean Savajol, the Moreau Germaine and Pierre took part in this journey. So it's my 20th visit with AFEA.

The airport had changed beyond recognition. Nowadays it is a state-of-the-art building with its fine Indian architecture which welcomes you! Getting there at night is always impressive with its huge crowd stretching over 333ft! I was thrilled to spot the smiling faces of Father Noël Pinto and of the devoted Raju Annapa quite quickly! As soon as we left the car park we were immersed, engulfed in the crowd of rickshaws, cars and a swarm of motorbikes, the new means of transport in Bombay. All of this in the infernal din typical of Mumbai....

Raju is an outstanding expert at driving in this heavy traffic where you have to keep on juggling and weaving your way between the gigantic pillars of the aerial metro. We arrived quickly at Snehasadan/Vinalaya, a haven of peace where our head office and homes 3 and 7 are located !

On Saturday morning there was a meeting with the house parents and that day was also the day for the former children and the family day as well (cf. our previous bulletin). I visited most of the homes :

- house 1 : a new home in a large building, the children will soon move in.
- foyer 2 : nothing has been started... discussion with the developers.
- houses 4 and 6 :

the refurbishing of home 4 consisting in rebuilding the supporting wall and the sewage network has been perfectly completed! However the same works of supporting wall and the renovation of toilets and showers need to be done urgently in home 6.



- house 5 : it's on the first floor of a 25-storey building; The children are getting used to these new conditions where space is more limited. They mix with the inmates of this block of flats and are well accepted !.

- houses 9 and 8: nothing to report except for the dilapidated state of home 9.

- house 10: statut quo for the time being.

Father Pinto is now helped by a young jesuit who told me he was worried about the significant drop in local donations.



I have also visited the Sisters in Navajyoti at their home in Marol (with fewer girls being welcomed temporarily) and I have also visited Sister Raj (the Shanti Bhavan home).



NEWS FROM SNEHASADAN HOUSES

SITUATION IN INDIA. The news below are from April / May

The lockdown continues here in Mumbai and we are not sure till when it will continue. As of now thanks to the grace of God all the children, staff, House parents and fathers are fine. We also have sufficient stock of groceries presently, but if the lockdown is extended further then we may have to make some arrangements.

As far as the studies of the children are concerned it is not much affected because it was already the end of the academic year and so the portion was already complete and only the final exams were left. These exams have been cancelled and the children have already been promoted to the next class based on their previous performance. The House parents continue to take some basic studies of the children to strengthen their foundation. Otherwise the children are enjoying their holidays playing, doing some creative work, reading story books, cooking etc.

Hope all of you are keeping well.

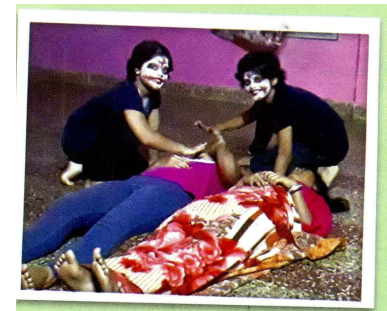


Street-play training by Karuna Nagangoudar (house 10)

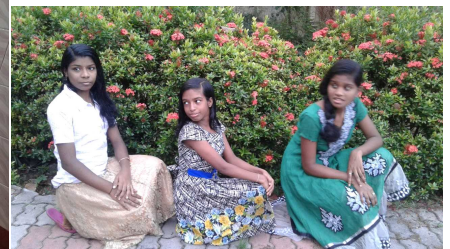
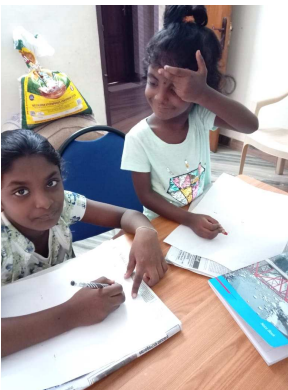

Thanks for your concern. At present children and we are ok. Sitting inside the house, not much news about surrounding s, people are crying, struggling for food, we are sharing with what we have. Feeling so sad. Government has promised many things, Praying God may do something for people of our world. Take care. Thanks for remembering us this crucial time. Ten children are with us, other children some of their relations came and took them because the Government made a strict order not to keep, if any relations send them with them, Among the ten seven of them have nobody to take. All are having some kind of fear. Moothakara three of them are under observation. People are struggling. What we are having we are sharing.

About opening the school we have no idea, but on line classes will begin soon, that time they will come here. All those who are close by also we are not able to go and meet so freely, because Police not allowing to visit the families, It is good, so we tell them to come to the house late in the evening, and we send the things with them. After 31st we will be able to go out, lock down may remove, hope so. All those who are at home they learn stitching, painting, making ornaments, dress etc... Here it is heavy rain, our net is not working properly, because of lock down people are not coming to arrange it.

NEWS FROM NAVAJYOTHI KARWAR

Thanks so much for your concern for the children and the staff of Navajothi Karwar. We are safe though the whole county is lock down we are in the house. Few children are here as they are in SSLC and PUC and they have to write university exam. Other way everything is closed here .remaining children are gone home.

NEWS FROM NAVAJYOTHI DAVANGERE (Karnataka)

At present there are only five children with us. The others are sent with their parents and relatives. Actually they have gone for holidays and they could not come back. The Davangere district Child Protection officer has selected our home Navajyothi Nilaya for quarantine for children who are picked up from street .So we have two cases now with us. We have to follow the decision of the DCPO to get back the children. More or less school will be opening either August or September. I hope all will be back by that time. As per your request, letters for the sponsors are ready.

I took the challenge calling all the Navajyothians .They came with their parent to write the letters and we sent them back with provisions for one month. We keep contact with them and see that they fed at home and taken care. We are supporting them even if they are not with us.

A splendid success as it has been awarded the title of « **best restaurant in Bombay !** »

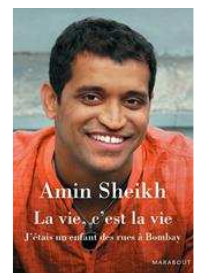

During my first stay in India, I visited "Father Placido" then Director of Snehasadan Homes, who helped me and showed me all the homes. The atmosphere in the home was very pleasant and there was a good understanding between the children and the people who supervised them "Sisters or house parents".

Subsequently, at each visit, I quickly had the impression of going to families (in my family) and to find there with joy all these children that I considered as my little godchildren, especially those of the Number 8 where my two goddaughters lived : Durga and Laxmi.

*Of course, I took the gifts given to me by godparents for their godchildren (via Muriel, the secretary of AFEA). I also included a few items (candies, chocolates, "pens or color" pencils, etc.) so that everyone received a small gift. It was a great pleasure to see them come together to share these little gifts. **THEY FORMED A HAPPY FAMILY!***

Examples: For colored pencils, when I returned to the Navajyothi home in MAROL, each child had drawn a picture and hung it on the wall to thank me in their own way. As soon as I arrived they took me near "their works". They were proud and I was very moved! (I took a photo of each drawing to remember it). A puzzle at Home 8 had the same success (all the girls gathered around, together, to start it).

*My conclusion: It is so beautiful, it is so heartwarming to see **THIS SHARED HAPPINESS** that I continue to sponsor a household considering that **all the children in this household are my godchildren. THE HAPPINESS OF AN ENTIRE FAMILY IS SO SUPERB!***

You will then receive periodical news thanks to the parents-responsible who will send, twice a year, a summary of the highlights, school results, arrival / departure of children, etc ... with drawings, photos and letters from children who wish, in the form of a small newspaper.



Participation. We maintain the same three levels as for individual sponsorships:

- 23 € / month (less than 8 € / month after tax deduction) to cover current expenses (food, health, schooling)

- 35 € / month (less than 12 € / month after tax deduction) to participate in fixed expenses (supervision, supplies, maintenance)

- any amount at your convenience, to participate in structural or investment expenses.
